School Size: For schools that include elementary or middle school levels, this number represents the entire student body, not just the high school grades.

Average Class Size: For high schools, class size is often determined by

academic content and is thus more difficult to generalize. To arrive at the data listed in this chart, we averaged class size figures listed by subject in the New York State Report Cards.

*Hunter College Schools are tuition-free "laboratory" schools created by

CUNY and governed by Hunter College. Though bound by state and some city regulations, they are not directly accountable to the city's Department of Education. Hunter students do not take the standardized tests administered to other public school students.

Reading These Charts

Most data in this chart comes from the National Center for Education Statistics, U.S. Department of Education, www.nces.ed.gov, and represents the 2005-06 school year. A few figures came

from the website maintained by the Independent Schools Admissions Association of Greater New York (ISAAG-NY). Numbers appearing in italics were provided by schools themselves, or were taken from schools' websites.

Overall diversity: some schools say they do not break out diversity data by race, but instead provide a percentage of overall diversity, which would reflect the non-white student body. "N/A" indicates no data was available for a specific race

category. If a school provided more than one student-teacher ratio figure for individual grade levels within the elementary level, we calculated an average student-teacher ratio for all elementary grades.
