**Reading These Charts:**

All information for public schools comes from New York State's accountability and overview reports for the 2005-06 year, the most recent data available at press time. The data for Hunter College Schools were provided by Hunter.

**School Size:** For schools that include elementary or high school levels, this number represents the entire student body, not just the middle school grades.

**8th Grade Exams:** This is the combined percentage of students who scored at levels 3 or 4 on the 2005-06 New York

State math and English Language Arts (ELA) exams. Students at those levels meet or exceed standards. Those at level 1 do not meet standards and those at level 2 show a partial understanding of the subject matter.

**\*Hunter College Schools** are tuition-free "laboratory" schools created by CUNY

and governed by Hunter College. Though bound by state and some city regulations, they are not directly accountable to the city's Department of Education. Hunter students do not take the standardized tests administered to other public school students.

### Reading These Charts

Most data in this chart comes from the National Center for Education Statistics, U.S. Department of Education, [www.nces.ed.gov](http://www.nces.ed.gov), and represents the 2005-06 school year. A few figures

came from the website maintained by the Independent Schools Admissions Association of Greater New York (ISAAGNY). Numbers appearing in italics were provided by schools themselves, or were taken from schools' websites.

**Overall diversity:** Some schools say they do not break out diversity data by race, but instead provide a percentage of overall diversity, which would reflect the non-white student body. "N/A" indicates no data was available

for a specific race category.

If a school provided more than one student-teacher ratio figure for individual grade levels within the elementary level, we calculated an average student-teacher ratio for all elementary grades.
